We spoke to Laura recently about her experiences of undertaking an apprenticeship, keep reading to find out more.

What apprenticeship are you studying and what does the study involve?

I am a Trainee Nurse Associate (TNA) which includes on the job training and day release to university, University of Central Lancashire (UCLAN).

What is your current job role and how did you get into your current role?

I am currently a Trainee Nursing Associate.

I have worked in Healthcare for a number of years and have lots of experience. I applied for the job when I saw that it was advertised. With working in a GP surgery my role differs quite a lot from the hospital setting. I perform regular health checks on patients with hypertension, diabetes, CKD (Chronic Kidney Disease), CHD (Coronary Heart Disease), learning disabilities etc. I use manual BP (Blood Pressure), perform ECGs (Electrocardiogram), perform venepuncture, Ear Irrigation and Spirometry, plus much more. I shadow many different health professionals and go on any training possible.

What have been the biggest challenges?

For me I struggle with the academic and research side, however I have been doing my research and asking for help when needed.
