New Writing North is looking to work with a freelance PR to support its communications strategy for two major literary prizes: the David Cohen Prize for Literature and the Gordon Burn Prize.

The appointed person/ agency will work to raise the profile of these prizes through national coverage. The ideal candidate will have strong experience working on literary prizes and/or books publicity. They will creative ideas about how to raise the profile of both prizes. have an extensive range of media contacts and be adept at securing excellent coverage.

The total budget for this work is £5000 (inclusive of VAT) to cover the responsibilities below. Travel and subsistence expenses will be covered on top of the fee.

Responsibilities

- 1) Securing coverage of prize announcements. This includes writing and issuing press releases; liaising with media, judges, publishers and authors; and setting up interviews. You will lead on PR for the following announcements, with the support of staff at NWN:
 - a) David Cohen Prize for Literature, winner announcement
 - b) Gordon Burn Prize shortlist
 - c) Gordon Burn Prize winner
- 2) Supporting the David Cohen Prize for Literature ceremony. This will include:
 - a) supporting guest list planning
 - b) attending the ceremony on 9 November in London and managing media
- 3) Supporting the Gordon Burn Prize for Literature ceremony. This work will include:
 - a) attending the ceremony on 7 March 2024 in Newcastle managing media
- 4) Working with the Senior Marketing & Communications Manager and Marketing Officer to devise and support social media campaigns around both prizes
- 5) Zoom meetings with members of New Writing North team
- 6) Reporting on coverage and impact for both prizes

About the projects

The David Cohen Prize for Literature

The David Cohen Prize for Literature was established in 1992 and is one of the UK's most distinguished literary honours. Awarded biennially, the prize is worth £40,000 and recognises a living writer from the UK or the Republic of Ireland for a lifetime's achievement in literature. The prize was originally managed by Arts Council England and subsequently by BookTrust. New Writing North has managed the prize since 2017.

The David Cohen Prize for Literature is funded by the John S Cohen Foundation, which was established by David Cohen and his family in 1965 to support education, the arts, conservation and the environment. The David Cohen Prize for Literature has been awarded to dramatists, essayists, biographers, novelists and poets, including Colm Tóibín in 2021, Edna O'Brien in 2019, Tom Stoppard in 2017, Tony Harrison in 2015, Hilary Mantel in 2013, Julian Barnes in 2011, Seamus Heaney in 2009.

The winner of the 2023 prize will be announced at a ceremony in London on 9 November 2023.

The Gordon Burn Prize

The Gordon Burn Prize was launched in 2012 to remember the late author of novels including Fullalove and Born Yesterday: The News as Novel, and non-fiction including Happy Like Murderers: The Story of Fred and Rosemary West; Best and Edwards: Football, Fame and Oblivion and Sex & Violence, Death & Silence; Encounters with recent art. The prize seeks to celebrate the writing of those whose work follows in his footsteps.

The Gordon Burn Prize was launched by New Writing North, Faber & Faber and the Gordon Burn Trust in 2012 and first awarded in 2013 to Benjamin Myers. In 2023, Newcastle University became sponsors of the prize, doubling the prize fund to £10,000.

The winner of the Gordon Burn Prize 2023-24 will be announced at a ceremony in Newcastle on 7 March 2024
