Students will have a range of costs while studying. They can apply to SAAS for help towards these, including tuition fees.

What's available?

Colleges and universities charge tuition fees for courses. Students apply to SAAS for these if they're studying an undergraduate or PGDE (Professional Graduate Diploma in Education) course. SAAS pay fees directly to their college or university. If they study in Scotland, they do not need to repay their tuition fees, but they must submit an application every year. If they're studying elsewhere in the UK they can apply to us for a Tuition Fee Loan of up to £9,250.

Students can apply for a non-repayable bursary and student loan to support them with general living costs while they study. We will assess the funding based on their gross (before tax) household income.

From the 2024-25 academic year, students will receive an increase to their funding package.

Payment Options

If you're on a higher education course that takes longer than a year to complete, you can choose whether to receive your funding payments over term time or to spread these payments over the year (12 months). Choosing to receive your payments over the year offers the added benefit for you to have your financial support spread evenly throughout the year to help you budget over the summer months.

Other types of funding are available based on personal circumstances, including grants for students with a disability or additional learning needs, student carers and Care Experienced students.

Key facts

Students can apply to us at www.saas.gov.uk from **April**, as soon as they know the course they want to study. They don't need to wait for exam results. If they do not get on the course they want, they can change or cancel their application through their online <u>SAAS Account</u>.

They will submit their completed application at www.saas.gov.uk and send any supporting evidence via our SAAS Document Uploader.

They must apply as early as possible and before **30 June** so their funding is in place for the start of their course (they'll need time to gather all supporting evidence).

- We will assess their entitlement and issue an award letter which shows how much funding they will receive.
- You should send us your income details and any evidence we ask for as soon as possible via our SAAS Document Uploader, so we can ensure the student receives their full entitlement.

They'll only receive the minimum amount of funding until you provide your details. If your household income is over £34,000 you do not need to provide income details.

Applying for a Student Loan

Students must apply for their student loan via SAAS.

The Student Loans Company (SLC) will process the payments and payment schedule..



They will not have to start repaying the loan until the April after they graduate or leave their course. They will be expected to pay 9% of any income they earn over $\pounds 27,660$ per year. This means if they earn $\pounds 28,660$ a year, they will repay $\pounds 7.50$ a month.
