
Easy Read

The law says that all health and care staff in services that are **registered** with the **Care Quality Commission** (CQC):



 Must get training on learning disability and autism, and



• The training should be right for the job they do.



The Care Quality Commission (CQC) is an organisation that checks the standard of health and social care services in England.



Registered means the health and care services agree to be checked by the CQC.



The Government recommends that staff get training called The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training on Learning Disability and Autism.

We have written new guidance called a code of practice. It explains:



- What training staff need to get to follow the law.
- What standards the training should follow.
- Why training is important.



Until we decide on the final version of the guidance, it is called a 'draft'.

We want to know what you think about the draft guidance to help us decide on the final version.





Standards




Standards are ways of checking that something, like training, is good enough.

There are 4 standards in the code of practice.

Standard 1





 All staff must get training about the most important things when caring for autistic people and people with a learning disability.

This is called Tier 1.



 Some staff must get more training, if they give care and support to autistic people and people with a learning disability.

This is called Tier 2.



 Some staff must also get extra training, if they make a lot of choices that affect the care that autistic people and people with a learning disability get.

This is called Tier 3.






